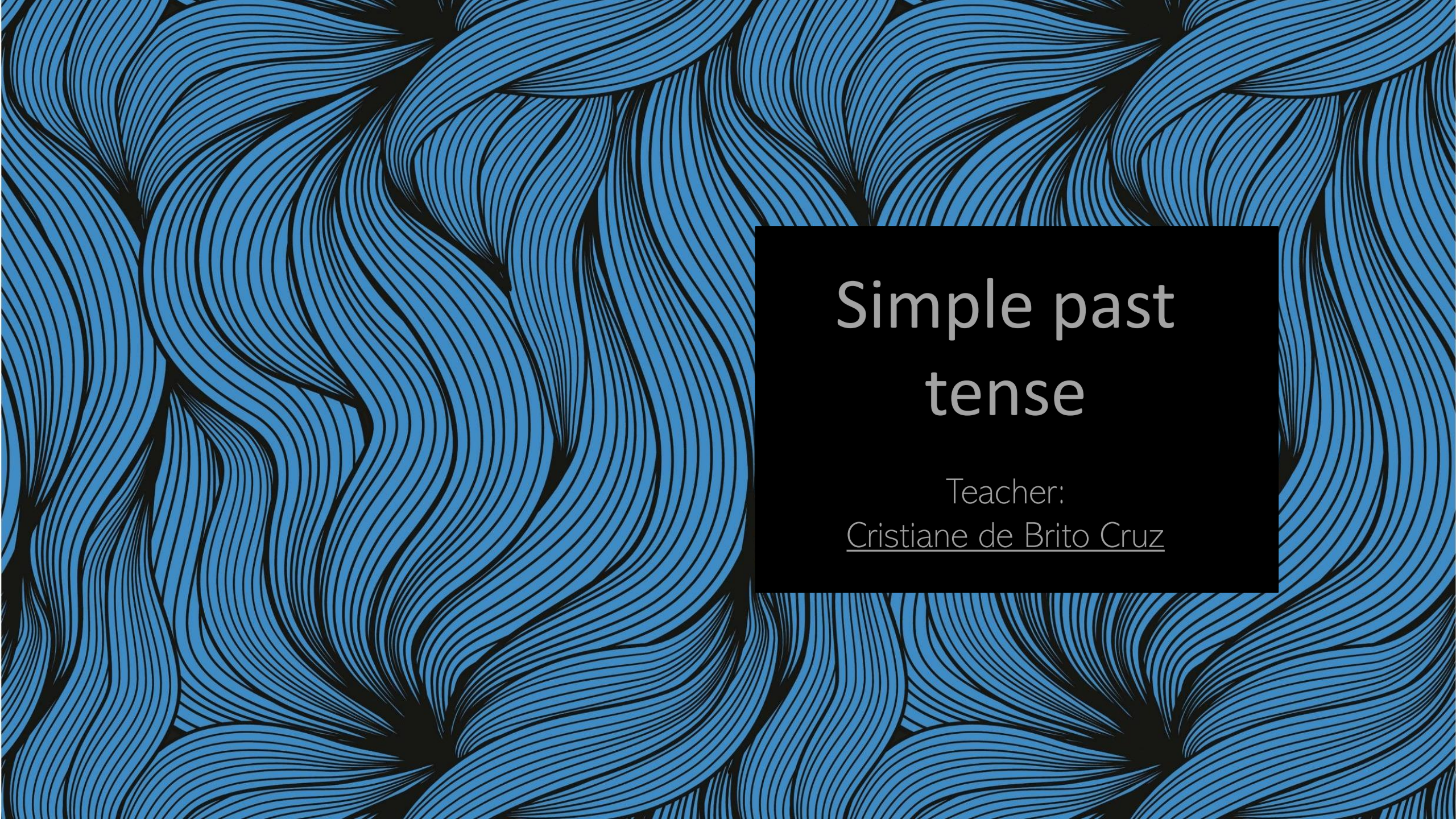
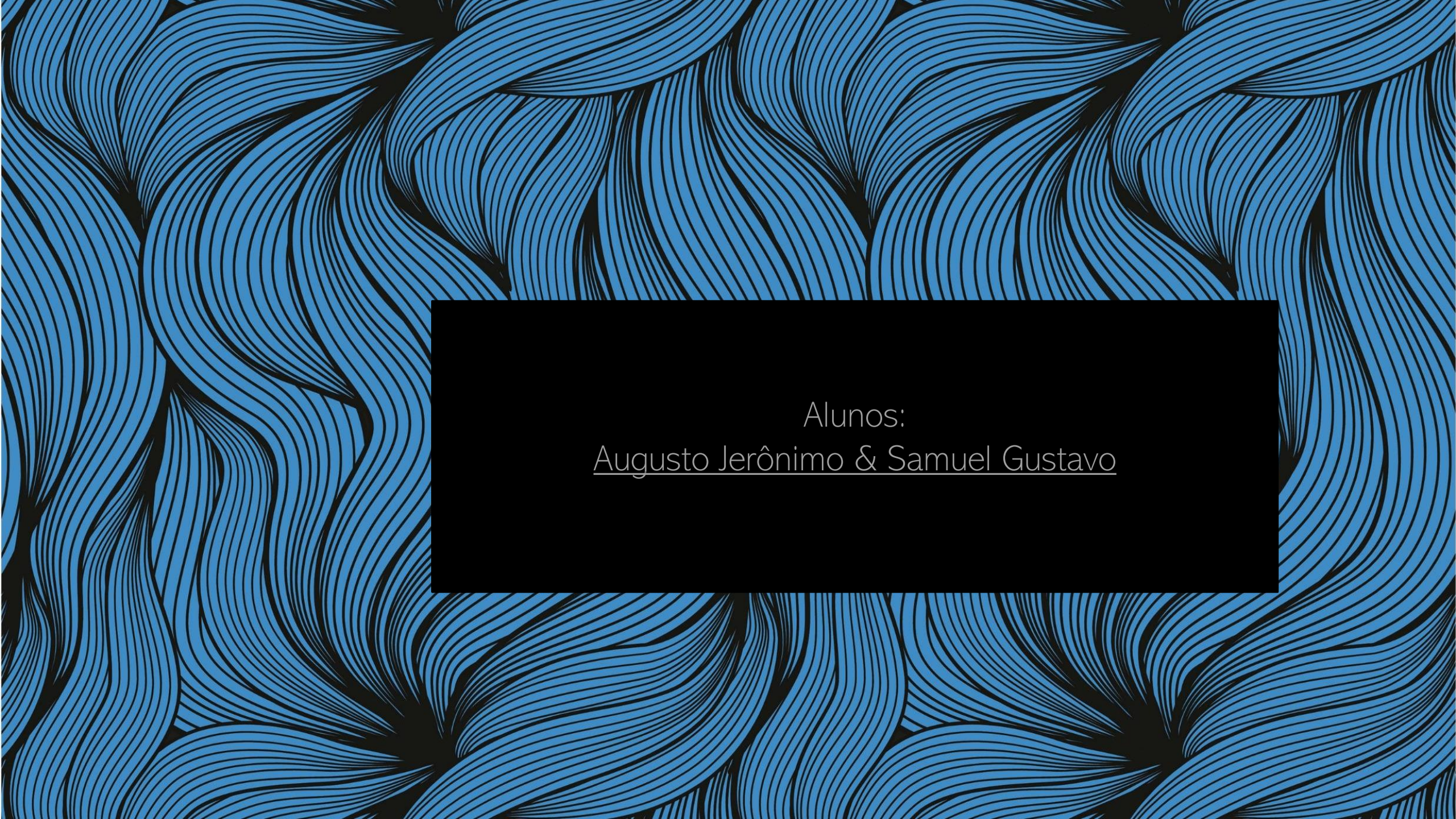

The Skinned Tapir
