- What English Learning Setting Is Best for Me?
- Independent study;
- Classroom setting;
- One-on-one: One-on-one classes are sessions with you and a teacher (or a conversation partner);



Tips for Improving English Listening with Independent Study

- Study a little bit at a time (5min a day daily routine).
- Listen to the same English podcast every day for a week.
- Find a podcast that you find interesting or entertaining and choose one episode;
- By the last day, you'll find that you can understand much more than on the first day.



How to Quickly Improve Your English Listening Skills Anywhere

- You can listen audiobooks, podcasts, TV shows/series, songs;
- Overhear an English conversation.
- Take advantage of "white noise."
- Read and listen at the same time.
- Experiment with different accents (Youtube channel How to cook that Australian English).



How to Quickly Improve Your English Listening Skills Anywhere

- Turn off the subtitles.
- Try to test yourself.
- Listen as you sleep (new words or pronunciation).
- Prepare your conversations before they happen (select words, think of questions and how to respond).
- Listen to yourself.
- Talk in front of the mirror or in your head;
- Create imaginary conversations (ask questions and give answers, pretend to be another person);



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How to Quickly Improve Your English Listening Skills Anywhere


- Listening to yourself (imitate actors in a movie including gestures);
- Use different audio speeds (audio/video) and challenge yourself;
- Join a conversation group (group of English learners);
- It's a fantastic way to make new friends.


How to speak English fluently and confidently: 10 simple tips

- Listening is the foundation for speaking! When you also want to practice speaking, here are some suggestions for how to improve English speaking skills.
- **1. Find An English-Speaking Conversation Partner**
- 2. Make Sure To Listen As Well As Speak
- **3. Record Your Conversation Practice**
- 4. Surround Yourself With The English Language (videos, podcasts, chatting, etc.)



5. Practice with Music and Movies (imitate the singer, movies help with vocabulary, idioms, slang, pronunciation)
6. Read Aloud (videos such as TED TALKS)
7. Talk To Yourself
