Akon, whose stage name is Aliaune Damala Badara Akon Thiam, was born on April 16, 1973, in St. Louis, Missouri, with roots in Senegal. He spent part of his childhood in Senegal, connecting with his cultural heritage. He is a singer, songwriter, music producer, and entrepreneur, blending R&B, hip hop, and African music in his style. Akon gained international fame in the early 2000s with hits like Locked Up and Lonely. These songs are part of his debut album, Trouble (2004).






LEGACY:

He successfully crossed cultural and musical borders, highlighting African influences in his music and promoting global acceptance of diverse musical styles.








GLOBAL CONTEXT

Global Financial Crisis (2008): The collapse of the US housing market led to a global recession, affecting economies around the world.


